Forever Free: Lincoln's Journey to Emancipation



THE YPSILANTI DISTRICT LIBRARY is one of only 80 libraries nationwide to host *Forever Free*, a traveling panel exhibit that stops at YDL-Whittaker Road from April 19 through June 2.

Forever Free features six separate displays with reproductions of rare historical documents, period photographs, engravings, lithographs, cartoons, and political memorabilia. Different sections focus on Young Lincoln's America, the House Dividing, War for the Union, the Emancipation Proclamation, the role of black soldiers in the Civil War, and the final months of the Civil War and Lincoln's life.

Many programs are planned to coincide with the exhibit's stay at YDL. Look for more details in the spring on: *Letters to Lincoln*; *Jamming on Lincoln* with alt-country singer Jason Ringenberg; *Michigan in the Civil War* with Richard Bak; *Living History Day* on May 6 with a special visit from President and Mrs. Lincoln; *Lincoln Consolidated Primer*; *Sojourner Truth*; and *No Army without Music—The Songs of the Civil War*.

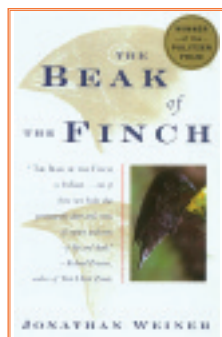
