Educate

Ideas Worth Spreading: TEDxYDL featured nine local speakers giving short, impactful talks about creating change in our community and abroad. The sold-out event was co-hosted by YDL and EMU's Halle Library.

Inspire

Preserving History: Historian and EMU Professor A.P. Marshall (1914–2001) recorded dozens of interviews with prominent local African Americans in the 1980s. YDL digitized this collection and made it available online at history.ypsilibrary.org.

Engineers Make a World of Difference:

Discover Tech, a traveling hands-on science exhibit, kicked off its national tour with 12 weeks at YDL. Over 15,000 visitors experienced the exhibit, including 33 school group field trips.





Year-Round Learning: 2,265 children and teens participated in Summer Reading, which prevents the "summer slide" by keeping kids engaged in reading and learning while school is out. YDL also worked with Food Gatherers to serve over 4,000 free lunches, filling the summer nutrition gap.

Talk, Read, Sing, Write, Play: Our early literacy programs center around the latest research, which shows that building literacy skills is about more than just reading. YDL's new "Play Kits" offer toys, books, and tips for engaging young kids. They've been flying off the shelves!

Entertain

The Future is Digital: YDL launched two new options for patrons to stream and download music, movies, audiobooks, comics, and more. Hoopla's streaming service and Zinio digital magazines are available anywhere instantly with no wait lists!

End of an Era: the tenth and final Ypsi Song Fest featured "country music royalty" Carlene Carter performing to a packed house, plus a fantastic Motown Revisited tribute concert organized by John E. Lawrence.

Looking Forward: An ambitious strategic planning process led to the release of a new five year plan covering 2017-2021.



Turning Outward: YDL spent the last year listening to community members by using a model developed by the Harwood Institute. After many conversations with diverse groups, we have a strong sense of the hopes and concerns our community shares, which informed our strategic plan.

Literacy on the Go: We've been all over town with our new book trike! The trike holds 60 books and is equipped with a laptop to check them out. It was a key feature of last summer's storytimes at the Farmer's Market.

YDL staff also launched monthly storytimes in the waiting room at WIC and literacy activities for teen parents at Corner Health Center.
