Revitalizing Library Spaces

- YDL-Superior got a complete makeover in January, making room for more computers and more books!
- Beezy's Cafe opened a coffee shop at YDL-Whittaker.
- The Bookmobile got a fresh and welcoming new wrap.
- Our CD Collection has been reorganized for easy browsing.
- A Ford Flex joined our outreach fleet, which will help with book delivery thanks in part to Bank of Ann Arbor and Gene Butman Ford.

Improving Communication

- Our new brand and logo bring a vibrant and fun look to the library and keep our communications clear and consistent.
- *The Loop* newsletter launched, reaching all 37,000 homes in the district three times per year with an 8-page newspaper.
- **Security cameras** were installed at all locations, and a new security log improves staff communication and patron safety.

- The Solar Eclipse brought more people to the library than any program in recent memory, with more than 1,300 people attending viewing parties and 2,000 pairs of eclipse glasses donated by NASA.
- The Summer Challenge launched in 2017, inviting people of all ages to read and try hands-on educational activities at the library and around town.
- Lunch and Listen continued for the third year, serving 2,978 nutritious free lunches and snacks to young people over the summer.
