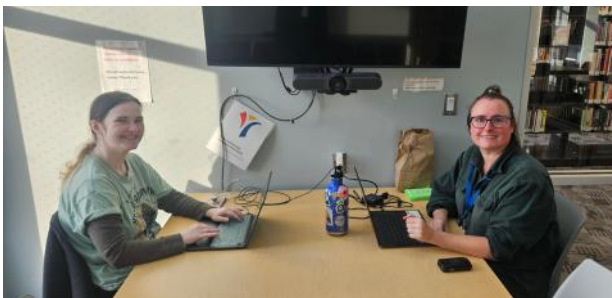


## LIBRARY SOCIAL WORK PROGRAM COMING TO YDL

The Ypsilanti District Library is transforming how patrons can connect with social service resources in the community, thanks to a generous grant from Washtenaw County Community Mental Health (WCCMH).

With funding from the WCCMH and Public Safety Preservation Millage, YDL will hire a full-time Library Social Worker by March 31. This MSW position will engage with the community at YDL’s three locations to help provide information, support, referrals, and follow-through to people experiencing challenging life circumstances. The Library Social Worker will help patrons seeking community resources such as mental health services, substance use services, housing services, food, education, and other social services.

“Embedding a social worker in the library will both support the community’s vulnerable populations and reduce the strain on YDL staff,” said YDL Director Lisa Hoenig.



Through the work of Margaret Ann Paauw and Chelsea Muto from EMU, Cynthia Wilson and Anna Lyon—student interns from EMU’s School of Social Work (pictured above)—are already in place at YDL-Superior to help connect those in need with vital services. A full-time LMSW will be able to offer case management services and will inform library programming with input from the community. They will also strengthen YDL’s existing partnerships with agencies like WCCMH, Trinity Health, Michigan Medicine, Barrier Busters, Ozone House, Corner Health Center, and SOS Community Services. The

social worker will not, however, provide onsite behavioral health treatments.

In addition to making the hire of a full-time social worker possible, funds from the county will go towards stipends for the EMU student interns, giveaway items—like water bottles, toothbrushes, or bus tokens—for patrons in need, and trauma training for library staff from EMU School of Social Work Professor Sarah Shea. Paauw will also conduct an in-depth evaluation of the program to gauge its sustainability as part of the three-year grant.

“YDL will be able to enhance the quality of its referrals, provide more in-depth assistance than staff could manage alone, and connect more patrons with much-needed community-based services and resources for improved mental, emotional, and physical health,” Hoenig said.

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# WE'LL MISS YOU, MARY!



Mary Garboden will leave big shoes to fill when she steps down as YDL's Superior Branch Manager. Her last day will be April 18.

Garboden moved from Grand Rapids to Ypsilanti in 2007 to start her job at YDL as an Outreach Librarian, a month after the small Superior Branch opened in the Fire Station at MacArthur and Harris.

In nearly 18 years at the library, Garboden advanced to Head Librarian of Outreach Services, and in September 2022 she became the first Superior Branch Manager, overseeing the full-service facility that opened on Harris Road in November 2022.

"I've often said that the Superior Library and I grew up together!" Garboden noted.

During the lead-up to opening the new branch,

Garboden experienced one of her most memorable moments as a YDL librarian—the Book Brigade in October 2022. Over 400 people lined up on Harris Road to pass thousands of books from the old branch in the fire station to the newly-built library around the corner.

"[It was] such a beautiful celebration of what libraries mean to Ypsilanti," Garboden said.

Through nearly two decades of watching patrons grow up, listening to their book recommendations, and working with staff to answer the trickiest questions, Garboden has left her mark.

"It's hard to put into words what Mary means to me, to this staff, and the YDL library system," said adult para-pro Monique Lopez-Geiman. "She approaches everything she does with thoughtfulness, empathy, and a genuine resolve to make whatever she touches better."

Youth para-pro Kallista Walker, who started when the new library opened, has also enjoyed Garboden's leadership.

"What a joy it has been working with Mary," Walker said. "She leads with care and deep compassion. She has so many superpowers!"

Clerk Sienna Higgins agrees. "She provides immeasurable support to all patrons and staff," Higgins said.

From jumpstarting the old Bookmobile with her Honda Fit to opening a brand new branch, the library has also left its mark on Garboden.

"I have gotten to be part of people's lives, often in very personal ways and for a very long time," she said.

She's looking forward to enjoying the library as a patron, with lots of walks from her house to the downtown branch in her future. She is also planning to camp around Lake Michigan, see family, spend time in the garden, and catch up on all of those book recommendations.

"I will miss getting to tell people I work for YDL, because honestly, it's just a magical place!" Garboden said.

# THE BOOKMOBILE HAS NEW STOPS

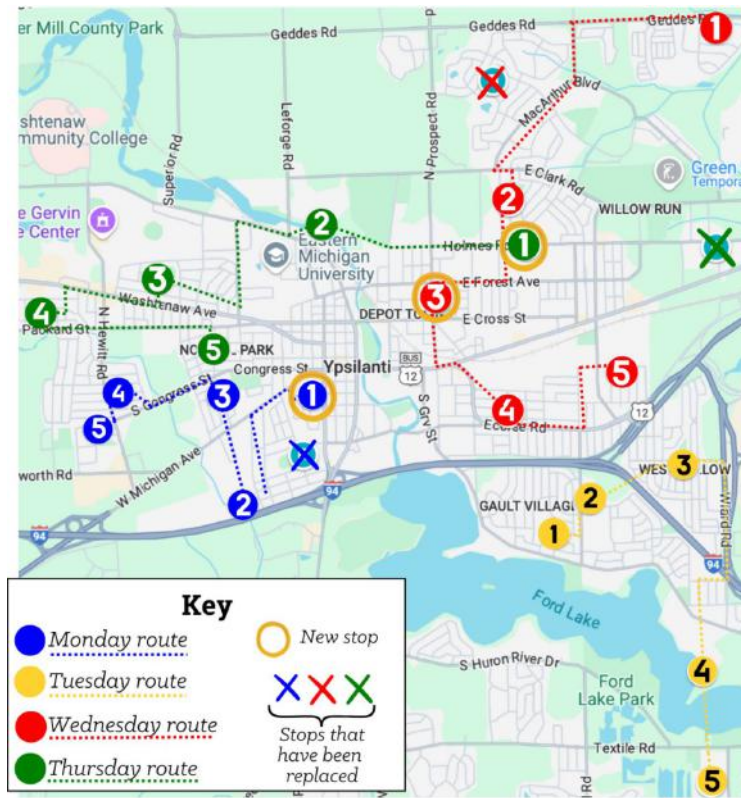
This spring, YDL is refreshing some of our Bookmobile routes.

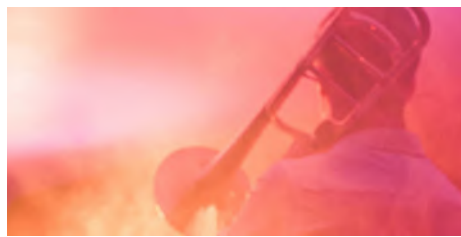

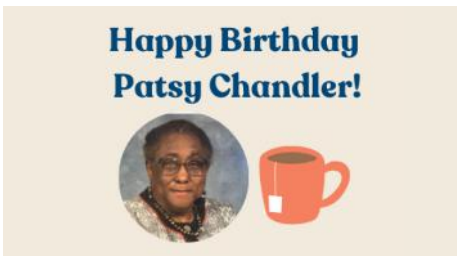

# SCHOOL LITERARY AND ART ADVENTURE



This May, parents and friends are invited to hear their favorite YCS third graders perform special poetry readings at the University of Michigan Museum of Art (UMMA).

For the 7th year running, third graders in the Ypsilanti Community Schools will enjoy a one-of-a-kind experience with 826michigan and UMMA. Throughout the spring, 826michigan—a nonprofit writing and literacy program for K-12 students in southeastern Michigan—provides in-school visits to each third grade classroom and coordinates field trips to 826michigan and UMMA.

Students are asked to imagine jumping into various artworks at the museum and describe what the experience might sound, taste, or feel like. These young writers then create collaborative stories based on those descriptions, and each student leaves with a scrapbook of their class's creations.

At the end of the program in May, students will be invited back to the museum for a special night, where they read their work next to the artworks that inspired them. This year, all are welcome at UMMA on Wednesday, May 7, from 5:30-7:30pm for this uniquely fun event.

Last year, an Erickson Elementary third grader found a way to very succinctly sum up the experience: "You are so fun! I don't ever want to leave here!"

## LCS EXPANDING CTE COURSE OFFERINGS



Starting this year, Lincoln Consolidated Schools (LCS) has added an on-campus Career and Technical Education (CTE) pathway in Mechatronics, which combines mechanical, electrical, and computer engineering

This program is designed to prepare students for success in both the workforce and higher education. Through the Mechatronics pathway, students can earn industry-recognized certifications that open doors to high-demand careers or further specialized training.

The Mechatronics program equips students to apply mathematical and scientific principles to the design, development, and operation of computer-controlled electro-mechanical systems.

These include systems with embedded electronics, sensors, and actuators—such as automated robots—and advanced automation systems. The curriculum spans multiple disciplines, including mechanical engineering, electronic and electrical engineering, computer and software engineering, and control engineering.

To support the program's launch, LCS partnered with SME PRIME (Partnership Response In Manufacturing Education) to create state-of-the-art lab spaces and provide specialized teacher training, ensuring students can access cutting-edge resources and expertise.

"As a Lincoln graduate, it means a lot to see an investment in this type of program and [these] opportunities at Lincoln," said Richard Brooks, a 2024 graduate of Lincoln High School, during the Lincoln Engineering Technology Advisory Board meeting in December. "I also appreciate the work and passion [that went into] creating this course."

CTE programs like Mechatronics play a critical role in achieving Michigan's Top 10 Strategic Education Plan goals by equipping students with the skills and knowledge necessary for success.

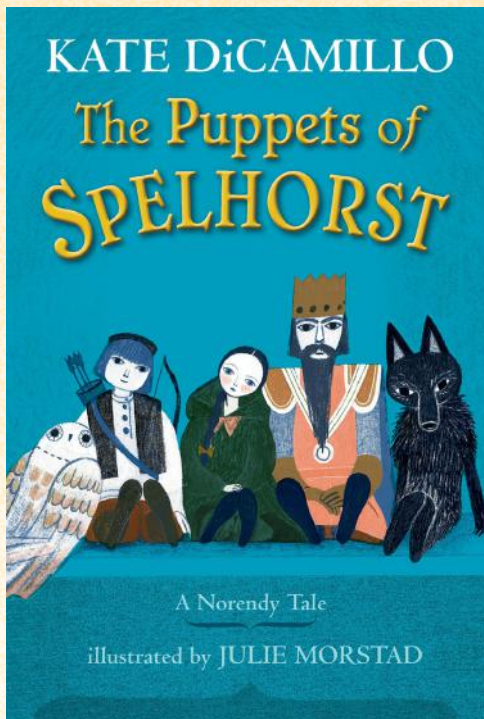
# THE PUPPETS OF SPELHORST IS THE 2025 FAMILY READ

To celebrate National Reading Month in March, YDL is excited to announce the 2025 Family Read: *The Puppets of Spelhorst* by Two-time Newbery Medalist Kate DiCamillo.

All month, we'll have programs and activities related to the book. *The Puppets of Spelhorst* is a short chapter book with beautiful black and white illustrations. The story follows five puppets—a king, a wolf, a girl, a boy, and an owl—from their purchase by an old seaman to being gifted to two young girls. While each puppet has unique hopes of flight, fame, and glory, and memories of sights and sounds they experience outside of the chest, they feel they are part of a bigger story that includes them all and they must stay together. Follow them on their adventures!

It is the first book in a planned trio of stories called *The Norendy Tales*, written to be read aloud and shared. Parents often read to young children, but it is also valuable to read and talk with older kids to improve reading skills, expand their vocabulary, and help them think about the world through books.

Each Family Read includes events that help readers dive into the book's themes and bring the book to life. We'll kick off the fun on March 1 with a Spinning Dot Theatre puppet show called *Catching Mirrors*.

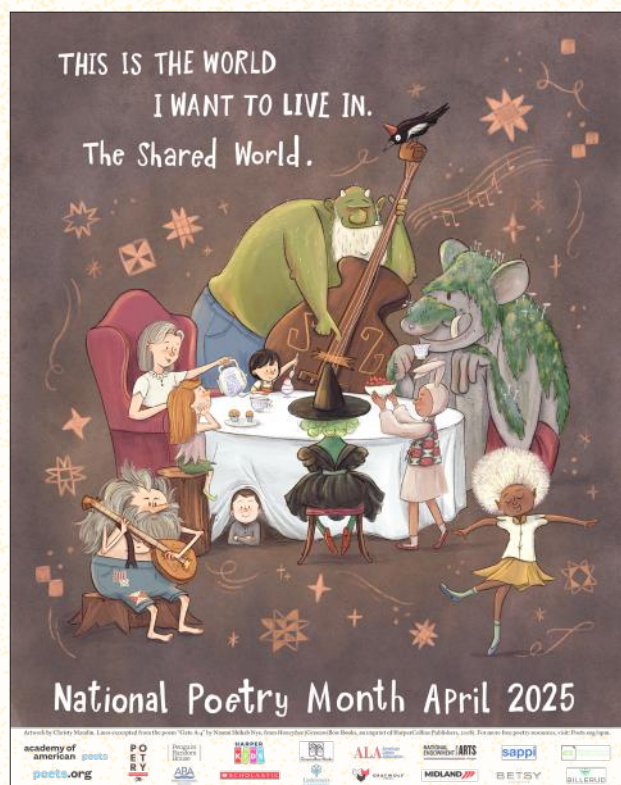

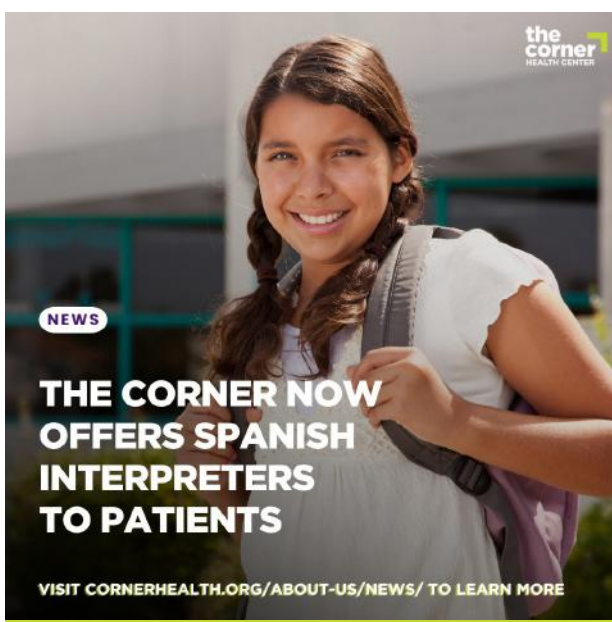


# CORNER HEALTH HAS SERVICES IN SPANISH

The Corner Health Center has partnered with Mexiquenses Unidos en Michigan to provide Spanish interpreters for their Spanish-speaking patients. Corner Health offers a full range of health care, mental health, and supportive services for young people as they transition to adulthood.

Extensively trained interpreters will support patients and staff for clinic services, behavioral health, perinatal health, and more. Interpreters are available for patients in person on Monday and Tuesday. Availability over the phone is offered Monday-Friday. The Corner's Spanish-speaking support line is available upon request when scheduling an appointment over the phone.

"Reducing barriers to care for young people in Ypsilanti has always been the spirit of The Corner," said Ashley Anderson, Director of Programs. "We are grateful for the opportunity to build trust amongst the Spanish-speaking population here. Having trained,



on-site interpreters is just the first step in making sure every young person in our community knows they have somewhere safe to go for judgment-free, quality, and affordable care."

A recipient of the 2022 Hometown Health Hero Award from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and the Michigan Public Health Institute, Mexiquenses Unidos en Michigan has worked with the Washtenaw County Health Department, Michigan Medicine, Ann Arbor Public Schools, and more to provide care and support to Latino families.

"Over the past six years, Mexiquenses has collaborated with community members to create multiple programs and initiatives aimed at social change through addressing social determinants of health to improve the well-being of Spanish-speaking immigrant communities," said Maria Militizer, president of the organization. "Our goal is to increase access to healthcare, mental health/SUD, and other social services to Spanish-speaking residents, so we are excited to partner with The Corner Health Center!"

# A NEW ERA OF COMMUNITY NOURISHMENT & CONNECTION



The heartbeat of Ypsilanti's local food movement is finding its rhythm in a new space. Growing Hope is moving the Ypsilanti Farmers Market to downtown Ypsilanti, creating a deeper, more accessible connection between the community and the land.

Starting Saturday, May 3, the market will welcome neighbors, growers, and artisans to its new home at

16 S. Washington Street/Black Lives Matter Blvd. The market will be open each Saturday through October.

According to Growing Hope, the new central location offers expanded opportunities for local farmers, artisans, and entrepreneurs to showcase their goods in a larger, more accessible space. Situated just one block from the transit center, the downtown market also ensures ease of access for residents across Ypsilanti, breaking down transportation barriers and advancing Growing Hope's commitment to food sovereignty and equity.

It also will offer the opportunity to deepen connections with local organizations like YDL and the Ypsi Bike Co-op, amplify the work of local farmers, offer live music and workshops, and more.

"We envision a space where the rich diversity of Ypsilanti is reflected in both our vendors and our customers," said Claire Austin, the Farmers Market Manager. "No matter their zip code or income, everyone will have the opportunity to enjoy fresh, culturally relevant food and experience the joy of coming together every weekend."

The Interfaith Council for Peace & Justice (ICPJ) is hosting a virtual series on Structural Racism by Ayo Magwood and Uprooting Inequity.

Ayo Magwood, an educational consultant with Uprooting Inequity, will lead three educational sessions followed by a fourth session

to reflect and make action plans:

**March 10 | 5:30pm: *The Origins of Race and Racism (Colonial Era)***

Through primary historical sources, trace the social construction of the Black and White "races" and the transition from a class-based to a race-based society.

**March 17 | 5:30pm: *Structural Racism: Historical Roots and Contemporary Expressions***

Get data on contemporary racial disparities and segregation, explore the concept of structural racism through several metaphors, and hear how contemporary structural racism is rooted in the enduring legacies of this historical discrimination.

**March 24 | 5:30pm: *Remediating Structural Racism***

Get some guiding principles to remediate structural racism, learn social psychology principles for fostering interracial cooperation, and learn specific strategies for change.

**March 31 | 5:30pm: *Fighting Structural Racism***

ICPJ Co-Directors Desiraé Simmons and Eleanore Ablan-Owen will host a reflection and action-planning conversation.

Magwood specializes in ideologically-neutral, evidence-based, and solution-oriented education on historical and structural racism, Asian and Latin American racialization, and interracial conflict and cooperation. She also trains educators on how to teach about historical and structural racism. Magwood has a B.A. in economics and international relations from Brown University and a M.Sc. in applied economics from Cornell University.

# \$575,000 AND COUNTING: MY FUTURE FUND CELEBRATES ITS FIRST YEAR

In its first year, the My Future Fund program opened more than 2,600 free college and career savings accounts for second through seventh grade students across Ypsilanti. Ypsilanti-area students already have over \$575,000 in their My Future Fund accounts, with more on the way.

In 2025, the program will welcome first grade students and National Heritage Academy (NHA) schools.

To celebrate the program's first year, My Future Fund gave out the "Big Dream Awards" at their Fall Celebration to schools from each district with the highest family engagement.

The inaugural award winners from the Ypsilanti area were:

- Estabrook Elementary School (Ypsilanti Community Schools)
- Perry Early Learning Center (Ypsilanti Community Schools)
- Childs Elementary School (Lincoln Consolidated Schools)

Awards were also given to individuals who championed the program in their school communities, including Kelly Mickel, Principal of Erickson Elementary School in Ypsilanti Community Schools.

**What is My Future Fund?:** My Future Fund is a county-wide children's savings account program, through which eligible Washtenaw County students receive free money and support for college and career training. Ypsilanti area students enrolled in a participating school can still claim their piece of the additional \$800,000 set aside for their My Future Fund accounts this year. Families of first-seventh grade students in Ypsilanti can unlock all the program's benefits, including the \$475 bonus deposit if they qualify, by completing the information form available on [myfuturefund.org](https://myfuturefund.org) by June 15, 2025.

## IT'S OKAY TO NOT BE OKAY

The #WishYouKnew youth mental health campaign has a new look

—From the Washtenaw County Health Department and Washtenaw County Community Mental Health



The Washtenaw County Health Department has refreshed its #WishYouKnew youth mental health campaign, and new resource materials are now available to kids, families, and those who work with them.

The original #WishYouKnew anti-stigma campaign, which ran from 2019-2024 with funding from Washtenaw County's Community Mental Health and Public Safety Preservation Millage, was developed with significant input from area young people. In fall 2023, the Health Department decided it was time to see if the original messaging and materials still resonated.

"Attitudes about mental health have evolved a lot since the pandemic," says Lisa deRamos, Communications Coordinator at the Washtenaw County Health Department. "Thinking about what youth have been through since the global health crisis—isolation from quarantine and remote learning, loss of loved ones, increased stress—all these factors have helped bring mental health awareness to the forefront for youth."

Young people from six different groups—including peer-to-peer depression awareness clubs and the Corner Health Center Youth Leadership Council—provided feedback on the original campaign materials. Themes that arose from these conversations included rejecting perfectionism and toxic positivity while embracing authenticity.

"Youth didn't want to see smiling faces in the campaign; they wanted to see teens, like them, who are also struggling with their mental health," says deRamos. "That's part of embracing authenticity

and rejecting toxic positivity—removing the mask and showing it's okay to not be okay."

deRamos and the team worked together with a professional creative marketing agency to develop new campaign materials informed by feedback from young people. Billboards, Connected TV, gas station TV, and social media ads with new campaign messages went live in Washtenaw County in the fall of 2024. Among the most popular is a video message that says, "You don't have to hide."

Young people also requested new resource materials including a pocket card to reference or share, and stickers and buttons they can wear to let peers know that they're someone safe to talk with. The pocket card highlights the 988 National Suicide & Crisis Lifeline and has a QR code to local mental health resources for youth and families, including the Washtenaw County CMH 24/7 Access Line: 734-544-5030.

Importantly, young people pointed out the need for additional mental health resources for parents and caregivers.

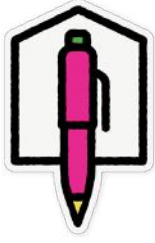
"They reminded us that there's a lot more stigma with their parents and grandparents around mental health than among peers," says deRamos. "They wished their parents were better informed, or had more tools in their toolkit to not only support them as youth, but to support themselves."

To address this, the Health Department collaborated with the Washtenaw Intermediate School District on their "Mental Health Workshops for Parents" webinar series by providing presentations on "How to Talk to Your Kids About Mental Health" and "How to Manage Stress Through the Nervous System."

The Health Department was recently awarded renewed millage funding to continue the #WishYouKnew campaign's mission to promote open conversations about mental health, reduce stigma, and connect young people and families to mental health resources. In 2025, they plan to continue collaborations with area young people and community partners to support youth mental health.

A-Ride works similarly to the fixed-route service with origin-to-destination, curb-to-curb, and door-to-door services. A-Ride trips are provided in accessible lift-equipped buses. All buses can lower as needed and have ramps.
