In August, we replaced the front sidewalk at YDL-Whittaker to make it safer, more level, lovely, and built to last.



In August, YDL brought aboard our first Social Work Interns. Cynthia Wilson and Anna Lyon, students from EMU's School of Social Work, did a needs assessment, developed a resource list, and laid groundwork for future field placements.





New home for TALK

The Midwest Collaborative for Library Services started managing TALK: Text and Learn for Kindergarten after YDL's National Leadership Grant period concluded in the summer. YDL launched the program in 2017 with the help of many local partners. TALK is now a nationwide service.



In August, YDL migrated to a new catalog system for an improved patron experience. Robust new features include an improved search and better record displays.

We began sending a mailer each quarter to people who have recently moved to the area.

Strengthening partnerships

Grants, donations, and other strategic partnerships helped YDL expand a number of services and programs that impact the community.

YDL was awarded a \$2,000 grant from the U.S. Chess Federation (USCF) to purchase USCF memberships, game timers, online tools, and more to expand our Chess Club and attract more young women and others from underrepresented groups to the game.

We replaced the checkerboard tabletops in YDL-Michigan's Library Plaza thanks to a wonderful donor.

- Using American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) grant funding from Washtenaw County, we installed new after hours pickup lockers at YDL-Whittaker.
- Toyota granted a second year of funding for new equipment and programs in our Project STEM @ YDL initiative.


